The gospel for this weekend refers to our relations with others. The Lord told the people that the old way of 'an eye for an eye' will not lead to peace and has no place in the Kingdom. The purpose of this Jewish law was to ensure that the punishment for a crime was no greater than the crime itself – in other words, it was a way of preventing revenge and especially excessive revenge and punishment. Even with this instruction, however, the punishment itself was at times excessive. By the time of Jesus, many of the scribes and Pharisees were uncomfortable with that particular law and it is in this context that the Lord spoke.

The Lord didn't suggest that punishment be done away with altogether, and neither did he suggest that justice not be done. Justice must be done and there are many ways in which it can be brought about but it does seem strange that killing someone to prove to them that their killing of another is wrong – the criminal is now dead and can give nothing back to society. Likewise, taking a hand leaves the criminal more dependent on charity than ever before.

The Lord suggested that we offer no resistance to those who come against us, though he doesn't suggest that we lie down and let others walk all over us. Essentially, the Lord was saying that by offering no resistance, by going beyond what the aggressor or persecutor wanted, we take the moral high ground and this can cause the other person to look again at their actions and to see that what they are doing is wrong and is denying dignity to the other person.

Justice is important but it must come with mercy and it must change the individual and make them a better person, not a bitter person. There is no place for revenge and vengefulness It must encourage contrition and forgiveness; it must be founded on the principle of love for others as our brothers and sisters.
